

## CO. CORK DOCTOR DEAD.

### ROMANTIC CAREER.

Our Macroom correspondent, wiring last night, states—The death of Dr. D. Lynch, J.P., Ballyvourney, removes a prominent and notable figure from the national and social life of Mid-Cork. After a brilliant college course, he served France in the Franco-Prussian War, and was, subsequently, associated with the Papal Zouaves. He then migrated to America, and lived ten years in a hut in the Rocky Mountains. He was forty years of age before he proceeded to take out his degrees in medicine; but his intellectual attainments made that task an easy one. He was immediately appointed to the medical officership of the Slieveruegh dispensary district, and the past thirty years of his life have been spent in Ballyvourney. The Irish revival movement had in him a powerful exponent. He was a prominent figure at the Ard-Rheis, and he established an industry in Ballyvourney, which gives employment to scores of young girls, who would otherwise possibly have emigrated. His death is greatly deplored in the district.
